They deserve your support and support from a community of enthusiasts such as this. To get the patch, follow these steps: Unzip the zip file you have downloaded (not the one that came up in the ZIP). The one you have should have a ".zip" extension. Extract the contents from the unpacked file to a folder (such as C:\Downloads\Nero 2018). I found it easiest to use WinRAR to do this. If you don't have it, you can get it for free. Open your file explorer (Win+X) and press CTRL+L. Navigate to C:\Downloads\Nero 2018*.exe. Select all the files, right click on them, and choose copy. Back to your downloads folder (where your "unpacked" file was located), select all the files in your "unpacked" folder and press CTRL+V to paste it (this is the part that actually creates the executable). This should be all that's required to patch Nero 2018. NOTE: If you're having problems extracting the file, try right-clicking on the "unpacked" file, and selecting Extract All. Try searching your computer for the zip file you had originally downloaded. Use the search function (CTRL+F) to search for the filename and replace it with something different such as Nero.zip Try updating your anti-virus program (you'll know if you do this because a prompt will appear stating so) Try temporarily removing any file from your downloads folder.
